Dear Parent of 6th Grade Player at 3&2 last summer:

We hope your 6th grade baseball season at 3&2 was enjoyable and that your child had a great time and learned more about baseball.

If your child is in the 7th grade this fall, the next stage at 3&2 is a bit more competitive. Managers of 7th grade teams are permitted to release players from the roster and have tryouts. Teams also have an option to bat nine or 10 players instead of the entire roster that they were required to do up to this point. In addition, the mandatory participation rule is no longer enforced. Free substitution has changed to players being allowed to re-enter a game only one time unless a team opts to bat its entire roster which allows for free substitution.

Many opportunities exist for the 7th grader as he prepares for high school. If he is interested in playing at his high school, a great way to learn more about what is required of a player at that level can be learned at camps directed by the high school coaches. More information about the camps can be found on the 3&2 web site. This is also a great way to become exposed to the high school coach and learn more about his philosophies and expectations.

Registration for the 7th grade program will start in December and end in early February. Every effort will be made to place all players that register to play.

An on-line manager's application is available on 3&2's web site under "Registration" if you are interested in managing a team.

Teams continue to be formed based on where the players currently attend school or by what area they live in.

There are several levels of play at the 7th grade level. Teams are seeded into these leagues based on how they did last year and if a team got stronger or weaker. 3&2's goal is to have each team win as many games as it loses. Stronger teams will play in the top league while lesser competitive teams will play in successively lower levels. The 18-game season will be played at both complexes with league play starting in late April.

The 7th grade season will culminate with the playoffs. Several teams from each league will have an opportunity to play in this season-ending tournament. Many other tournament opportunities exist at 3&2 during the summer as well. Not all teams take advantage of these opportunities.
